## OTHER SCHOLARSHIP ACTIVITIES

As of October 2014, the Centers for Disease and Prevention have adopted Project Salud (an HIV prevention intervention among Latino migrant workers) as an Evidence-Based Intervention (EBI).

The HIV/AIDS Prevention Research Synthesis (PRS) Project at the CDC identifies evidence-based interventions (EBIs) and best practices to help HIV prevention planners and providers in the United States select interventions most appropriate for HIV prevention within their communities.

The Evidence-Based Interventions (EBIs) and Best Practices are identified by the CDC's Prevention Research Synthesis Project through a series of ongoing systematic reviews. Each eligible intervention is evaluated against explicit a priori criteria and has shown sufficient evidence that the intervention works.

In November 2014, I attended the 24th Annual Midwest Stream Farmworker Health Forum in San Antonio, Texas and conducted a 3-hour pilot training of Project Salud among health professionals directly involved with Latino migrant populations across the United States.
